PRCUA 2018 Young Adult Committee Report

In attempt to involve more young adults in the PRCUA community, we propose the following:

- 1. In an effort to bring younger members to the conventions, sponsor internship or shadow programs during convention and non-convention years.
 - a. Shadow a chairperson, vice chairperson, corporate lawyer, journalist, member of the budget and grievance committee, election committee etc. at Convention
 - b. Shadow and internship programs at headquarters and the museum
 - c. Market the internship program to schools opening more options for other young adults to join
 - i. Include service learning and community service opportunities
- 2. Educating young members about their duties as adult members of the PRCUA.
 - a. Introduce the responsibilities of an adult member
 - i. The process of becoming and serving as a delegate at the Convention
 - b. How to be a delegate information session for first time delegates one day prior to the convention
 - c. Establish youth social activities and possible workshops for delegates explaining convention materials and forming connections between first time delegates the day before the Convention
 - d. Session etiquette
 - e. Market job opportunities, internships and leadership positions within PRCUA and make positions more readily available to younger members
 - i. Flag bearer
 - 1. Put an upper age limit on the position
 - Make the role available to women
 - f. Establish a committee for alternates at the Convention, e.g. Young adult committee
- 3. Form a junior board that would be responsible for events for young adults. Multiple boards can be formed within districts or societies to organize events for the regions in which the boards function.
 - Single location performance for all PRCUA dance groups in the form of a National dance festival with cultural workshops
 - i. Includes all level dance groups
 - ii. Cultural workshops towards language, cooking, folk activities, etc.
 - iii. Rotating locations
 - iv. 2 years off the Convention
 - b. PRCUA sleepaway summer camp
 - i. Summer camp aims to bring together polish and polish-american youth
 - ii. Focus on connecting the younger generations
 - c. Young adult banquet
 - i. National or district social banquets

- d. Home office lock-in
 - i. Attempt to make younger members aware of positions in the office
- 4. In addition to Facebook, include other social media platforms such as Instagram and Twitter run by the Young Adult Committee to advertise events
 - a. Move away from paper advertisements and make digital media a larger part of information dissemination
 - b. Make social media more visible online
