Starting January 2020, all submitters of articles and photographs for the Naród Polski are asked to follow the set of guidelines regarding the submission process. These guidelines were set up by the PRCUA Executive Editor and the Executive Officers.

Text must be submitted in Microsoft Word. All ads for the upcoming district/society/school events must be submitted in a Microsoft Word or PDF format so that they can be corrected and adjusted to the space available.

Article size:

Up to 500 words – no more than 5 photos.

Up to 600 words – no more than 3 photos.

Up to 700 – no more than 2 photos.

For reports on multiple events, events should be combined into one article with a short description about each event. One photo per event is permissible. Photos of large groups are suggested instead of individual photos or photos of small

Only articles regarding momentous anniversaries of PRCUA districts/societies/schools, annual events such as the Cinderella-Prince Charming Ball and Michigan State Ball, sport tournaments, Opłatek and Święconka as well as the Vice President's column (alternating in Polish and English), and PRCUA national events such as PRCUA anniversaries and the PRCUA Quadrennial Convention may include additional

It will be at the discretion of the editor and the Executive Committee to make a final decision regarding which and how many photos will be used.

Original photos (not computer-printed copies) should be submitted in JPEG 300 DPI format. Do not submit scans of computer-printed or xerox copied materials; these will not be used.

PRCUA HALKA HAS DOUBLE THE REASONS TO FEEL HONORED

On Sunday, November 3, the Polish Central Citizens Committee of Detroit held its 47th Annual Pulaski Day Banquet and chose the PRCUA Halka Dancers to be honored for celebrating their 50 years, and awarded the Pulaski Medal of Honor to Halka director, Laura Hejza. The event was held at the Barrister Gardens in St. Clair Shores, MI, and was attended by various Polish groups including a representation of PRCUA comprised of President James Robaczewski, Vice President Micheline Jaminski and Secretary-Treasurer Agnieszka Bastrzyk. Laura was one of six who received Medals of Honor. Polish Central Citizen Trustee Celeste Grabowski read Laura's biography.

Laura Hejza has been a part of the PRCUA since the Halka Dancers began, being the youngest dancer in their first recital in 1970, then after 13 years graduated to became an assistant to their teacher. She was then approached to become the teacher/choreographer of the PRCUA Gwiazda Dancers and did so for 20 years. During that time, she belonged to the Wisla Polish Song and Dance Ensemble, traveling to Poland to perform and learn as much as possible about Polish folk dancing and culture to pass along to her students. Currently, Laura is a part of the PRCUA Zakopane Dance Ensemble and is also working to revitalize the PRCUA Women's Division of Michigan.

Laura's children, Brandon and

Katelyn, followed in the family tradition of being a Halka dancers, where their "Babcia", Rita Cerankowski was the director for 35 years until Laura succeeded her in 2015. Laura is thankful to her mother for instilling the importance of knowing her Polish ancestry and grateful for the support of the PRCUA. 

Established in 1994, the PACC is a not-for-profit organization incorporated in the State of Illinois as a business association. The Chamber is dedicated to fostering its members'





SERVANTS OF JESUS

On October 6, 2019, The Servants of Jesus celebrated their 45th anniversary. Separating in 1973 from the province of Felician Sisters of Livonia, MI, they had formed a new community.

A video, "Write the Vision Down: The Journey of The Servants of Jesus," presenting the history of the sisters, was shown to the guests. Being called by the Second Vatican Council to return to the spirit of the founding mother of the Felician Mother Sisters, Angela Truszkowska, Genevieve Rakocy called a meeting to see if there was an interest in pursuing this venture. Thirty three sisters attended the meeting in July of 1973.

John Cardinal Dearden of the Detroit Archdiocese encouraged and was supportive of this new group of sisters.

In December 1973, the sisters met in Crofton, Canada at a lodging of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (IHM Sisters) to elect their leaders, Sisters Genevieve Rakocy, Roberta Kolasa and Barbara Celeskey, and to write a draft of their early life directives. They decided to meet monthly at the different places of their ministries. Until recently, they have kept meeting regularly.

Selecting a name for themselves was a process. They prayed and put forth many combinations until they arrived at Servants of Jesus, which was a phrase Mother Angela had used to encourage her sisters during a time that they were disbanded because of political uprisings in

On August 6, 1974 the sisters received an official decree from the Sacred Congregation of Religious in Rome and were recognized by the Archdiocese of Detroit as a new community.

Initially, they were short on funds so they took jobs. All the sisters were able to obtain employment in their varied professions: teaching, pastoral work, nursing, and administration. Eventually, they took positions in the Church and one as a lawyer.

In 1986 the sisters wrote a mission statement (confirmed in 2016), choosing to live the gospel radically, ministering to the poor and to those who had the greatest need.

The Servants of Jesus encouraged women to join them in prayer and in works of mercy, thus a group called the Associates of the Servants of Jesus was formed. Their purpose is to carry on the mission of the Servants of Jesus by helping in many capacities. Their ministries vary: delivering food to the homebound, teaching English as a second language, preparing the immigrants for US citizenship, visiting the sick and other works of mercy. They come together with the Servants in prayer whenever possible.

In 2018, the Servants discerned that their ability to provide canonical leadership for themselves was limited and chose to look to another religious community to accept this position. With the approval of and an appointment by Archbishop Allen Vigneron of the Archdiocese of Detroit, Sister Paula Cooney, IHM accepted the position of President of the Servants of Jesus for three years. The Servants of Jesus continue to "live as Jesus lived and to serve as Jesus served".

PRCUA President Emeritus Wallace Ozog and his wife Joann attended the celebration and had the opportunity to view the beautiful and informative video of the Servants of Jesus. Not only as individuals, but as a community, the sisters had to make important decisions as they approached a new journey. They endured difficulties since they did not have the necessary funds to start this new life. They en-

countered many challenges, but by praying and working together they succeeded in overcoming them.

Thank you to these dedicated women who have kept the community alive for so many years. May God bless those who are still living with good health so that they will continue their work.





How the 2020 Census will invite everyone to respond



Every household will have the option of responding online, by mail, or by phone.

Nearly every household will receive an invitation to participate in the 2020 Census from either a postal worker or a census worker.

95% of households will receive their census invitation in the mail.



Almost 5% of households will receive their census invitation when a census taker drops it off. In these areas, the majority of households may not receive mail at their home's physical location (like households that use PO boxes or areas recently affected by natural disasters).



Less than 1% of households will be counted in person by a census taker, instead of being invited to respond on their own. We do this in very remote areas like parts of northern Maine, remote Alaska, and in select American Indian areas that ask to be counted in person.

(This is separate from our follow-up efforts; census takers will visit all households that wer invited to respond on their own and haven't.)

What to Expect in the Mall

When it's time to respond, most households will receive an invitation in the mail.

Every household will have the option of responding online, by mail, or by phone.

Depending on how likely your area is to respond online, you'll receive either an invitation encouraging you to respond online or an invitation along with a paper questionnaire.

Letter Invitation

- · Most areas of the country are likely to respond online, so most households will receive a letter asking you to go online to complete the census questionnaire (or to respond by phone).
- · We plan on working with the U.S. Postal Service to stagger the delivery of these invitations over several days. This way we can spread out the number of users responding online, and we'll be able to serve you better if you need help over the phone.

· Areas that are less likely to respond online will receive a paper questionnaire along with their invitation. The invitation will also include information about how to respond online or

When I was a youngster, my uncle Stan - a truly great man - operated a very popular and wonderful establishment known as "Orzech's Tavern" in the Warszawa Polish neighborhood of Cleveland.

Once the clock chimed, the ball was lowered on Times Square, and "Auld Lang Syne" was playing, we'd gather by the telephone (land line...black stationary rotary phone...not a very long cord...loud bell ringer) and wait.

First there would be a call from the kitchen. It was my mother wishing us all a happy, healthy, new year. The phone got passed around to the other aunts who were up there helping, too. And, of course, it got passed around among my brother, my grandmother, and me, too. Then, after a bit, the phone would ring again. It was my father calling from downstairs in the tavern. You could hear the band playing in the background and the people celebrating as he also wished us a blessed new year and all the very best in it. Any aunts and uncles in the vicinity got to add their two cents worth, too.

As I was sitting down to write this article, my mind drifted back to these new year's past for a simple reason, I believe. It wasn't to be reminded that most of the people associated with this story - and even the places - are no longer with us. They're never far from my memory, anyhow. It's to be reminded of the love and care which I was blessed to have as the foundation of my life. It's to be reminded that, even though the cast of characters and the places associated with them always keeps changing, the same remains true today. But, this is true, I think, not just for me. I think most of our readers can find similar things from their past which bring to mind the love and blessings in their own lives.

So, as we welcome in this new year of our Lord 2020, I will be praying that all of you find that little bit of time necessary to think back on the love and blessings which have been a part of your life; that you'll have the understanding eyes to see that, while the cast of characters and the places associated with them may have changed, much of this endures in its own way still today; and, most of all, I'll be praying that as this new year unfolds, you'll be fondly looked upon by others because you'll be that loving source of care and blessing in their life.



CARNIVAL IN POLAND



"NARÓD POLSKI" ROZPOCZYNA 2020 ROK W NOWEJ SZACIE

Prezentujemy Państwu pierwsze tegoroczne wydanie "Narodu Polskiego" w nowym wydaniu. Minęło pięć lat od chwili wprowadzenia ostatnich zmian. Pomyśleliśmy, że wkraczając w nowy rok i w nową dekadę, nadszedł czas, aby naszą gazetę uatrakcyjnić.

Pierwsza zmiana to nieznacznie zmniejszona wielkość naszych stron. Bardziej zauważalne zmiany dotyczą sposobu, w jaki ułożone zostały nasze strony. Strony zostały zorganizowane w odrębne sekcje: biznes, kultura, informacje członkowskie, sekcja polska. Kalendarz wydarzeń ukazywał się będzie wyłącznie w języku angielskim.
