

PRCUA OFFERS 2020-2021 SCHOLARSHIPS

Economic conditions in the United States and throughout the world, as well as an ever more competitive job market, have made the need for an undergraduate, graduate, or professional degree a virtual necessity for today's student. At the same time, the higher costs of education pose a serious and challenging barrier to students and their families to bear. The PRCUA recognizes the necessity of assistance for students of the Polish American community and has developed several financial vehicles to aid in the pursuit of undergraduate and graduate degree programs.

During the 2020-2021 school year, the PRCUA will offer two types of scholarships. The PRCUA Education Scholarship is open to all who apply, whereby the PRCUA Fraternal Scholarship is open exclusively to members of the PRCUA. Students can apply for each scholarship once annually, but they may receive only three awards of each scholarship during their lifetime. Scholarships are specific to the school and educational program named in the application. The deadline for submitting applications is June 1, 2020.

PRCUA Education Scholarships are awarded to students based on the number of applications submitted and are available to all students, even those who are not members of the PRCUA.

- 1. Applicants must have successfully completed their freshman year of undergraduate studies before the deadline for filing an application. An official transcript or other documentation from the applicant's school must be attached to the completed application form or sent directly by the educational institution to the PRCUA on or before the deadline of June 1.
 - Eligible applicants include sophomores, juniors, and seniors enrolled full-time in undergraduate studies or those students enrolled in a graduate or professional degree program. Full-time enrollment shall conform to those guidelines established by the federal financial aid program: a minimum of twelve credit hours for day students or eight credit hours for evening students. Part-time graduate students are also eligible.
 - Applicants must have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale or 3.5 or better on a 5.0 scale.
 - 4. All applicants must be either citizens or permanent residents of the United States.

The PRCUA Fraternal Scholarship is available to eligible PRCUA members. For the 2020-2021 school year, the PRCUA will award scholarships

totaling \$30,000, to be broken down as follows: ten scholarships of \$2,000 and ten scholarships of \$1,000. These scholarships are open to all current PRCUA members. Applicants must fulfill all the requirements listed above AND be a member of the PRCUA for a minimum of five years AND have an active certificate of a minimum of \$5,000 (and must be current with its payments).

The following options are available to applicants who do NOT fulfill the above five-year requirement:

- Three-year membership with the PRCUA holding a \$25,000 certificate, or
- Four-year membership with the PRCUA holding a \$15,000 certificate.

Note: Applicants must have active certificates and be current with their payments for five years after receipt of the final scholarship.

Selection of award amounts and recipients will be made by an independent committee of jurors. For both scholarships, awards will be granted to applicants based on the highest number of points earned, including an essay (in English).

The PRCUA acknowledges that continuing one's education is important to get ahead in life. Everyone is invited and encouraged to take advantage of our scholarships. Scholarships from the PRCUA are but one of its many member benefits.



Echoes Celebrates Wigilia





Believe it or not, at the end of this month, on February 26th, we will begin the Holy Season of Lent. In

Polish, it is called Wielki Post, which is translated as the "Great Fast" as it is the most important fast of the

year. Lent runs from Ash Wednesday until the beginning of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. In order to make this Lent more meaningful, it might be helpful to review the basics of Lent proposed to us by the Church.

Traditionally, there are three disciplines that are associated with Lent: Prayer, Fasting and Giving Alms. These three disciplines cause us to look beyond ourselves to a greater good. Prayer deepens our relationship with the Lord. Fasting helps us to focus our attention away from our own wants and desires. Giving alms reminds us that others are in need and as followers of Christ; we are to show them His love and compassion.

These disciplines can be a very practical guide for us during the season of Lent. Many times, we may not even think about practicing all three disciplines during Lent, as it seems so many of us get caught in the trap of thinking about fasting, the "what can I give up" frenzy that often becomes associated with Lent. While fasting or abstaining from something we really like during Lent can be helpful in our growth in holiness, prayer and giving alms, which includes giving of ourselves can be equally or even more important for our spiritual growth. Sometimes prayer and alms-giving can be harder for us than anything we may have chosen to give up.

Here are some practical examples for putting into practice these disciplines. In the area of prayer, consider praying the Stations of the Cross at your parish or at home or attending a daily Mass. In the area of fasting, abstain from snacking between meals during the entire season of Lent, or if that seems too daunting, pick a specific day of the week to do so. In the area of giving alms, write a check to your favorite charity, especially if that charity serves the poor or make a visit to someone who is in a nursing home or hospital.

The Church offers us these three disciplines in Her wisdom and Her concern for our spiritual growth. I am inclined to think that these three dis-

ciplines work together in harmony to help us on not only our Lenten journey but also our journey toward genuine holiness.

During this season of Lent, let us pray for each other that we grow in holiness by prayer, fasting and giving alms, returning to the basics of the Lenten Season, as we prepare to ascend the Holy Mountain of Easter with great joy. Praying that this Lent is a time of renewal and spiritual growth for all of you! God Speed!

WELCOME NEW PRCUA POLISH SCHOOL

The Polish Roman Catholic Union of America warmly welcomes a new Polish educational institution - the Zbigniew Herbert School of Polish Language and Culture - to the organization. The school is located in Palos Heights, IL in the Chicago Christian High School building. Classes are held on Saturdays from 9 am to 1 pm. The Herbert School implements the educational program based on the Core Curriculum for Students Studying Polish Abroad issued by the Ministry of National Education in 2010. The school's patron is Zbigniew Bolesław Ryszard Herbert (1924-1998) - a Polish poet, essayist, playwright, creator of the famous poetry series "Mr. Cogito," author of radio plays. An economist, lawyer and philosopher by profession, he was also invested in the Order of the White Eagle. His books have been translated into 38 languages. He was a well-known and esteemed poet in Poland and abroad and winner of over twenty literary awards.

At the end of 2019, the Herbert School became partially funded for its activities by the PRCUA, with plans for full funding. Forty students have already joined the PRCUA family. Each of them received a discount in tuition fees from the school.





Sezon zapisowy na ubezpieczenia na 2020 rok dla większości mieszkańców USA można uznać za zamknięty. Wydawałoby się, że możemy odetchnąć spokojnie. Niestety nie tak do końca. Jest jeszcze parę obowiązków, którymi musimy się zająć by mieć pewność, że wybrany przez nas plan wystartuje jak planowaliśmy w 2020 roku.

Posiadacze Medicare:

- 1. Karty Medicare z Claim number zawierającym Państwa numer Social Security straciły już ważność. Od 1 stycznia możemy posługiwać się wyłącznie kartami zawierającymi 11 znakowy Medicare number składający się kombinacji cyfr i liter. Jeśli nie otrzymaliście Państwo nowej karty, proszę skontaktujcie się jak najszybciej z najbliższym biurem Social Security Administration lub zadzwońcie na 1-800-MEDICARE.

Podobnie jest z planami zniżkowymi na leki na receptę firmy Aetna. Odsprzedała ona swój blok planów zniżkowych na leki na receptę firmie Wellecare. Kartą tej właśnie firmy musimy posługiwać się w aptekach od 1 stycznia 2020.
- 6. Jeśli po wykupieniu planu typu Medicare Advantage jesteśmy niemile zaskoczeni, to nadal mamy możliwość jednorazowej zmiany w tzw. OEP.

Posiadacze Obamacare:

- 1. Sprawdźmy Eligibility Letter, czyli formę zatwierdzająca poziom pomocy finansowej na rok następny. Dokument ten zawiera również listę żądań, które jesteśmy dostarczyć zobowiązani do urzędu Marketplace, aby nasz plan został zatwierdzony lub kontynuowany w kwocie ustalonej w trakcie aplikacji. Najczęściej proszeni jesteśmy o dostarczenie dokumentów potwierdzających status emigracyjny, numer Social Security, poziom oczekiwanych dochodów, utraty ubezpieczenia, zawarcia związku małżeńskiego lub rozwodu.
- 2. Upewnijmy się, że opłata za pierwszy miesiąc została uiszczona. Ta opłata ma krytyczne znaczenie i może oznaczać być

albo nie być dla naszego planu typu Obamacare na 2020 rok. Pamiętajcie Państwo, że jeśli plan nie wystartuje ze względu na nie dokonanie pierwszej opłaty miesięcznej, to nie będzie można go wskrzesić przez cały rok.


